Wabash still has a variety of bareroot fruit trees ready to plant, but the time is running out. They are beginning to bud and some blooming, so they will be potted shortly. Now is the time if you are considering a fruit tree for your yard and family enjoyment to come by and make your selection from a wide variety of America's favorites.

As a bareroot tree it is cheaper, easier to transport and can be planted immediately in your location of choice. Once potted it is suggested let it remain in the pot for approximately 6 months to develop its root ball.
